

Eastern PA Coalition for Abandoned Mine Reclamation Program August 2008 Progress Report

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Capacity Building:

- Gave presentation with two other OSM/VISTA members, Catherine Webster (Schuylkill Conservation District) and Savanna Lyons (ACCWT headquarters in Beckley, WV), on the ACCWT OSM/VISTA program to attendees of the 2008 EPCAMR/WPCAMR AMR Conference in State College; assisted with conference check-in and registration.
- Received \$1691 grant funding through Partnership for the Arts Grant, provided by Scranton Area Foundation and PA Council on the Arts, to be used for costume design and fabrication for elementary school skits based on EPCAMR's "AMD Avengers vs. the Pollution Posse" educational activity book; wrote and distributed explanatory press release.
- Generated content for new page on Orange Water Network website, with information for volunteers and OSM/VISTA applicants.
- Researched grant opportunities from Lackawanna Heritage Valley Authority; 2008 Educational Mini-Grant details will be announced soon.

Watershed Projects & Monitoring:
