**January 2010 Progress Report** 

### **Education & Outreach**

- Posted several articles to EPCAMR FaceBook Account; Provided Leigh Ann with our EPCAMR PSAs to send off to local radio stations for publicity and outreach on our upcoming planned Spring Cleanups for 2010
- Ordered Pocket Guides for identification or plants, bugs, wetland plants, and rocks out of our Orion Grassroots Network Grant
- Participated as a judge at the West Side Career & Technical Center Skills USA Judging Competition as an environmental community leader upon invitation from the Leadership Program Director Lori Vandermark
- Provided an update to Stefanie Milewski-Conservation Alliance, Lackawanna County on EPCAMR Activities in the region and our search and need for mine maps to assist us with our future Mine Pool Mapping Project for the Northern Anthracite Fields
- Finished up and submitted or "Cultivating Tree Trout and Understanding AMD Impacts in the Wyoming Valley" Aquatic Resources \$5000 grant application to the PA Fish & Boat Commission with the assistance of our intern Leigh Ann
- Talked with Rayne Brown-EPCAMR volunteer intern and LCCC student about coming in and helping us begin to create cardboard templates of aquatic insects for the Educational AMD Comedy Skit
- Awarded a \$5000 grant from the Foundation for PA Watersheds to promote the use of Datashed ( www.datashed.org )in the EPCAMR Region to our constituent watershed groups that have water quality monitoring data that needs to be digitized and entered into an online database management system
- Reviewed the letter of invitation prepared by the SRBC that has gone out to community groups in the EPCAMR Region within the Susquehanna River Basin to attend a discussion meeting on February 11 from 6-8PM at the PSU Hazleton Campus, about the development of an Anthracite Region AMD Remediation Strategy and assistance with the Mine Pool Mapping efforts of EPCAMR for the Northern and Eastern Middle Anthracite Coalfields

- Talked with Kathryn Bawden, ACCWT Recruiting Coordinator and informed her of our inability
  to find additional matching funds in the amount of \$5500 for another OSM/VISTA at this time;
  We do have space that could be rented to other regional Anthracite Heritage Alliance
  OSM/VISTAs that need office space, however, we just do not have the funds to sponsor
  another full-time OSM/VISTA at this time and we wish we could; Discussed with her issues
  related to housing as well
- Prepared a Letter of Support to the Luzerne County Commissioners encouraging them to keep Moon Lake County Park open for future educational programs that we provide and the work we do with local youth on water quality and watershed studies; The County Park is set to be closed and all staff positions eliminated from the 2010 County Budget

### **Technical Assistance**

- Conducted an interview with Greg Anderson, a Brown University Graduate student, who is working on a senior thesis titled "Conserving Ecological and Industrial Heritage in Pennsylvania's Anthracite Region"
- Meeting with Mrs. Janice Leiby-Horticulture Teacher at the Wilkes-Barre Career & Technical Center to review our Living2Serve Grant for the Avondale AML Beautification Spring Field Days and Budget allocations; Completed a 2010-2011 Living2Serve draft Grant Application for \$3000 and forwarded it to Janice to submit for the Huber Breaker Anthracite Miner's AML Memorial Park Landscaping and Paver Project
- Worked with Arielle Avishai-OSM and Robin Lighty-PA DEP on completing our draft standard for AMD discharge Inventories and Treatment Facilities and another Pre-SMCRA Surface Coal Mine Boundary with Bruce Johnson-from North Dakota AML in preparation for their review at the OSM National Geospatial Data Standards Team Meeting at the end of the month in San Antonio, TX
- Conducted a public Webinar at the EPCAMR Technical Assistance Center for community groups interested in PA DCNR's "Greening" Webinar to roll our their new Keystone C2P2 Parks & Recreation grants based on the Sustainable Sites Initiative, a national model
- Reviewed a sample completed Qualified Hydrologic Unit Plan (QHUP) from Todd Wood-PA
  DEP BAMR, a link to the restoration plan for the Upper West Branch of the Susquehanna
  River, a blank QHUP form, and a link to the draft Set Aside Program Guidelines; These
  documents along with the restoration plan should give some guidance on what is needed to
  establish a QHUP; The documents should answer some of the question is that have arose at
  different meetings as far as what information is needed for a QHUP
- Provided Bill Weihbrecht, Senior Stream Restoration Specialist-URS Corporation with information on relocating streams using impervious liners; He's working on a project for a quarry where there is significant loss of flow due to karst geology and sinkholes; He'd like to relocate the stream and install a liner; He's looking for some guidance as far as types of liner

and installation requirements; This stream has good trout numbers so we would over excavate and be putting in substrate over the liner; Directed him to Dave Greenfield-PA DEP BAMR who has completed several projects in the Region with liners to some degree of success

### **Project Coordination**

- Prepared an official request letter for the Hicks Creek NSCD AML Restoration Project at the
  direction of Jackie Lincoln-PA DEP Growing Greener Grants Ctr for our formal extension of the
  project through June 30, 2010; Received formal approval the same week; Contacted our
  Project Officer to get an update on the review of our Environmental Assessment that was
  submitted in December 2009; Submitted a request for reimbursement for the Project through
  December 2009
- Attended a Senior Staff level meeting in Harrisburg with Paul Schwartz, SRBC Executive
  Director and others along with Mike to present an update on our *Mine Pool Mapping Project*and to discuss a future partnership effort on the development of an Anthracite Region AMD
  Remediation Strategy; Worked with Tom Clark-SRBC Basin AMD Coordinator to develop a
  preliminary budget request that SRBC will be submitting to the Legislature to implement the *Anthracite Region AMD Remediation Strategy* and the *Mine Pool Mapping Project* begun by
  EPCAMR for the Northern Anthracite and Eastern Middle Coal Fields; \$200,000 over 3 years
  to complete
- Prepared several contracts amendments for Ian Palmer, Roger Hornberger, and the Dauphin CCD to extend the grants until June 30, 2010 for the *Mine Pool Mapping Project*
- Prepared a contract amendments for Borton-Lawson to extend the grants until June 30, 2010 for the Hicks Creek NSCD AML Restoration Project
- Submitted a Reimbursement and Progress Report for the *Mine Pool Mapping Project* to PA DEP Project Officer Dan Koury, Pottsville DMO; Talked with Chris Murley, *Abandoned Mine Research* Director, about setting up a meeting where he might be able to show us some of his collection of underground mining shots of roofs, pillars, water-filled areas, for the Anthracite Region that we might be able to use in the report that we are writing; There are some great photos that could explain a lot of things that we are interpreting from the mine maps for these regions and their interconnectedness to multiple layers underneath the ground; EPCAMR will give full credit to the photographer

 EPCAMR Staff Conducted an AMD Watershed & Assessment Tour of the Nescopeck Creek Watershed and Jeddo Mine Tunnel with 24 Berwick Middle School students and the Columbia County Conservation District Watershed Specialist, Stephanie Singer; Conducted a stream visual assessment and performed some AMD water sampling

- Attended the Office of Surface Mining Geospatial National Data Standards Team Meeting in San Antonio, TX to develop Title IV mapping standard practices for GIS

- Asked Drew McLaughlin, W-B City Administrator, if he knows if it's possible for him or Butch Frati-Planning Director to help us identify the property owner from the City's Tax Parcel ID Map to find out who the owner of that parcel (s) of land belongs to along High St. where we have a planned illegal dump site cleanup planned for the Spring 2010; EPCAMR has a landowner access agreement that we would like to provide to the landowner, regardless if it is a private landowner or a public entity, such as the City, that would allow us to conduct the cleanup and be freed from any liability for personal injury and that would cover the landowner from any actions being taken against them, since this is a volunteer cleanup effort; It is a document that we've modeled after the PA CleanWays access agreement form; They are also a partner with EPCAMR in this effort.; They will help to provide us with educational materials on illegal dumping and will report our numbers state-wide following the collection of the materials, debris, and recyclables
