October 2007 Monthly Report

Education and Outreach

- Attended a lecture for the King's College community to discuss EPCAMR's role and the partnership that we maintain with regional artists who have hung works of art at the 2nd Anthrascapes AMD Art Exhibit at the Widman Gallery, King's College to showcase previously displayed artwork utilizing the iron oxides that EPCAMR has been collecting for several years trying to find beneficial resource recovery uses for the pigment; Interviewed by a local King's College Art Critic about the Exhibit for their local student newspaper; Attended an artists reception during the middle of the month on the "Third Friday" of October, when the public are most likely to generate foot traffic through the exhibit in Downtown Wilkes-Barre; 25 pieces of art work are on exhibit at the Art Show
- Presented an AMD/AML Outreach Awareness Program to 15 college geology/education/landscape architect students from Keystone College and 6 high school student artists interested in working on an Iron Oxide Book Binding Project with their teacher Ivana Pavelka, who is a Photography Professor at Keystone College, that has exhibited artwork with EPCAMR at both Anthrascapes AMD Art Exhibits
- Conducted an AMD/AML Outreach Watershed Tour with 3 Hazleton Area Junior High Schools (Drums, Valley, & Freeland) 8th Grade Gifted Classes (30 students) of the Audenreid AMD Treatment System and discussed other projects and problems associated with various other mine discharges within their school districts such as the Jeddo, Gowen, and Derringer Mine Tunnels
- EPCAMR played a role in creating a new one-hour DVD documentary about mining and abandoned mine drainage in Pennsylvania entitled, "Hope for Polluted Waters"; WVIA premiered the DVD;

http://www.wvia.org/hdtheaterstudio/ExplorerHome.html; **Hope for Polluted Waters** tells the personal stories of the individuals and groups working throughout the coal-mining regions of Pennsylvania to clean up the abandoned mine drainage (AMD) that pollutes over 4,000 miles of waterways in the state.

The focus of the story is the people themselves; their passions, frustrations, challenges and ultimately their triumphs over pollution. Dedication drives these individuals, whose goal is a better future. These emotions are evident in every one of the volunteers who is trying to correct the wrongs of the past. While AMD is caused by historic mining activities, the program focuses on history more than to explain what AMD is, how it was created, and what it has done to the communities and environments it has impacted. The main focus is truly on the personal stories and everyday actions of people in today's world.

 EPCAMR Program Staff created our first ever, bumper sticker for EPCAMR to promote our organization, our work, and our website; EPCAMR Board approved the purchase of 1000 bumper stickers for future outreach programs; EPCAMR will sell them for \$1 each

Technical Assistance

- EPCAMR Staff and Board Members were interviewed by Lynn Hocker-Whispering Creek, and John Dawes-Foundation for PA Watersheds about our organization's ability to complete abandoned mine reclamation projects, environmental education and outreach efforts, partnership abilities, networking, public relations, and ability to leverage multiple funding sources for regional projects throughout the Anthracite Region; An evaluation and interviewing process is being completed statewide with some leading environmental organizations that have stood out over the years that are still addressing abandoned mine drainage and abandoned mine reclamation issues in PA; Encouraged to apply for a \$2000.00 Convening Grant to assist the EPCAMR Board with updating its Strategic Plan and redefining our organization's Board Development
- Continuing to work with Mike on developing a "LEAP" Grant Proposal to the Environmental Support
 Center in Washington D.C. for nearly \$10,000 in donated professional services and other consultant
 services to assist EPCAMR with securing additional funds to build our organization from within as
 we begin to move forward after being in existence for nearly a decade and continuing to do good
 work
- Provided Mike Korb-GTS Technologies, Inc. a link to the Mahanoy Creek ScarLift Abandoned Mine Reclamation Report
- Provided a letter of support for Earth Conservancy's Brownfields Cleanup Grant Application to install a Maelstrom Oxidizer aeration system to the Phase II Wetlands Treatment System at Dundee, along Nanticoke Creek

Project Coordination

- Finalized the Memorandum of Understanding (MOA) with the Dauphin County Conservation District
 to serve as a pass-through partner with the USGS to provide modeling services and
 hydrogeological services related to the GIS Mine Pool Mapping Project
- Contacted Ian K. Palmer regarding the GIS Mine Pool Mapping Project to discuss setting up a
 meeting with him after to finalize an independent contract for services to assist with the data
 collection of needed information for the GIS Database to build the Mine Pool Mapping layers for the
 Western Middle and Southern Anthracite Coal Fields; A meeting has been scheduled for November
 7th, 2007 at the Pottsville District Mining Office to discuss the project further and to meet with Dan
 Koury-PA DEP Project Officer
- Submitted a signed Contract for Independent Services and an MOA on behalf of EPCAMR to work
 with PEC on two separate projects related to abandoned mine reclamation; One for GIS Mapping
 needs to complete the *Catawissa Creek Rivers Conservation Plan* and the other for GIS
 Mapping needs to identify locations where chicken poultry manure can be applied to abandoned
 mine lands (*Manure & Mine Lands Project*) in Schuylkill County, however the area must be in the
 Susquehanna River Basin

Conferences and Trainings

- Provided some comments to Andy McAllister-WPCAMR on our planned Conference Call for to begin the discussions on the coordination of the 2008 10th Annual Conference on Abandoned Mine Reclamation
- Submitted an abstract co-authored by Mike Hewitt and myself at the request of the OSM for the March 2008 GeoSpatial Technology Conference to be held in Atlanta, GA on our RAMLIS 7.0 GIS Mapping Tool
- Provided Duncan Wilson, ACCWT Clean Streams Practicum Coordinator with some presentation
 materials that were provided at last Fall's ACCWT Training for the OSM/VISTAs; EPCAMR
 Program Staff were not able to make it down to this year's training, however, we were able to
 provide training materials for the OSM/VISTAs for their packets
- Requested the use of the Musto Environmental Education Center from Diane Madl, PA DCNR for a future planned Strategic Planning 2-Day Training for the EPCAMR Board of Trustees to update our Strategic Plan and to discuss future Board Development; Request was granted
