Education and Outreach

- Followed up with Costumes by Barbara, Luzerne, to discuss our Scranton Area Foundation Grant
 with her related to the designs for The AMD Avengers vs The Pollution Posse Activity Book;
 Barbara is designing most, if not all of the costumes and props for the grant that will be utilized by
 school children in 2009
- Meeting with the Times-Leader's Vice-President of Retail Advertising Marketing Director, Kim Dudick and Kathy Pelleschi, Account Manager to discuss developing a marketing partnership relationship for the 2009 Pocono NE RC & DC Energy Expo being planned for June 2009 at the Luzerne County Fairgrounds
- Submitted an PA DEP EE AMD Outreach Progress Report and reimbursement on behalf of the Luzerne Conservation District
- Interviewed a potential summer intern candidate Shawn Jones, from Wilkes-Barre, who is currently
 enrolled at Montana State University and will be back in the area for the Summer of 2009; Provided

- Interviewed a potential intern candidate Rayne Browne, from Berwick, who is currently enrolled at Luzerne County Community College, and would like to intern with EPCAMR during the Spring 2009 semester; EPCAMR is awaiting for her Federal Work Study approval, where she would be paid by LCCC and all EPCAMR would have to do is track her hours through a log and provide supervision, direction, and a work plan for her time spent on EPCAMR activities, no more than 20 hours/week
- Conducted a meeting with Michael Spangenberg, Falls, Wyoming County, a gentleman who may be looking for some part-time GIS work and was interested in the Coalition; Discussed some future possibilities of the need for a potential part-time position to work on our OSM Applied Science grant, if funded later in the Summer 2009; Informed him that EPCAMR would keep his resume close at hand
- Provided a Letter of Support for the preservation of the Huber Breaker in Ashley, PA to the Luzerne County Commissioners and to the media that published the support letter online on one of their websites, the Times-Leader
- Attended the Mining & Reclamation Advisory Board Meeting and co-presented with Mike to provide an update on our Anthracite Mine Pool Mapping Project; Obtained 3 additional Letters of Support from the MRAB, PA Anthracite Council, and the Citizens Advisory Council for our OSM Applied Sciences grant submittal

Brooks Foundation to establish an EPCAMR Technical Assistance Center to focus on the Susquehanna & Delaware River Watersheds impacted by AMD; Developed a fully completed EPCAMR Operating Budget for 2008-2009 as a follow-up request from the Cora L. Brooks Foundation; Submitted the completed application
- Continued to develop for the Foundation for PA Watersheds a draft Request for Technical Pre-Qualifications and a RFP specific to the Mine Pool Mapping Project in the Shamokin Creek Watershed and about setting up a Review Committee independent of the SCRA and NCCD to avoid any conflicts of interest
- Continued to work on the \$200,000 OSM Applied Science Grant application to continue to work on the Mine Pool Mapping of the Northern Anthracite and NorthCentral PA Coalfields; Received 3 Letters of Support from the PA DEP Mineral Resources Management Deputy Secretary, Scott Roberts, Lock Haven University, Mansfield University; Sought another letter from Bloomsburg University; Submitted the grant before the January 16th deadline
- Meeting with Jim Wetzel-Weatherly Borough Planning Commission and Jim Clauser-Carbon County Conservation District to assist them with taking a closer look at some of the Upper Lehigh AMD discharges, particularly the Hazle Creek discharge; EPCAMR pulled nearly a dozen partners together for a meeting to address the issue and provided Jim with some avenues for technical assistance funding that is currently available through the Pocono NE RC & DC C-SAW Technical Assistance Grant and Trout Unlimited's AMD Technical Assistance Grant; Produced a Hazle Creek map for the meeting for distribution using our RAMLIS tool to display and handout at the meeting
