Education & Outreach

- Participated in a conference call with other panel speakers for the upcoming Pennsylvania Environmental Council's Policy Conference in Harrisburg, PA hosted by John Walliser to talk about AMD and Mine Water Resources across PA: Opportunities and Challenges; Attended and presented as a guest panel speaker on September 17th for the PEC Policy Conference; Submitted EPCAMR Executive Director Bio and copy of completed presentation in PDF format
- Attended the Plymouth Historical Society's Program on the celebration of the 145th Anniversary of the Avondale Mine Disaster in Plymouth Township, PA and served as a guest speaker to talk about the work that EPCAMR had done with volunteers over the last decade to preserve and improve the abandoned mine land site that is now soon to become a trailhead location; In the last year, the PA DEP BAMR Office came in and installed a bat gave at the tunnel opening and assisted with the relocation of one of our community gardens at the site to make improvements

- EPCAMR provided Dan Koury, PA DEP Pottsville District Mining Office with mapping and information on the Nescopeck Creek basin above State Route 309 related to stream designations since some of the designations of tributaries in that area seem to be listed improperly because that particular area is High Quality-Cold Water Fishery, Migratory Fishery waters
- EPCAMR reached out to the Pittston Historical Society regarding some mine maps that we could possibly scan for
 them and add to the PHUMMIS for the Mine Subsidence Insurance Program going forward when our grant
 agreement is amended; The maps are mostly from the Ewen Colliery and the #9 Colliery from the PA Coal

 Mike about the PA DOT 4-0 Maps that contained thousands of borehole logs form the Casey Highway Project in
 Lackawanna County that we might also incorporate into our amended grant agreement with PA DEP MSI
- Provided the EPCAMR Staff with background information on Red Spring Run and Campbell's Ledge Run in the Lackawanna River Watershed for a possible submission to the Coldwater Heritage Partnership Planning Grant Program before the grant deadline of December 19th, 2014
- Kevin Trychta, Benton Foundry, Benton, PA has a beneficial use permit for the use of foundry sand and is looking for viable alternatives in abandoned mine reclamation and has reached out to EPCAMR to see if we can locate some places or uses for the material

Project Coordination

- Cleared brush and conducted a cleanup at "The Point", along the confluence of the Lackawanna and the Susquehanna River on the Lackawanna Valley Conservancy property that will serve as a take-out for an upcoming river kayak trip with SMS, LLC who are partners on the *Old Forge AMD Treatment Project*; River kayak trip along the N. Branch Susquehanna with SMS, LLC on September 5th to conduct upstream baseline river water sampling
- Meeting with Nick Lylo-PA DCNR District Forester-Bureau of Forestry to update him on the work that EPCAMR has
 completed on the 3050 acres of the Mocanaqua Highlands, in terms of trail marking, cleanups, and assessment of
 illegal dumping on Earth Conservancy's tract of property that will soon be purchased and become a part of the
 Lackawanna State Parks Forest Tract; Discussed future partnership opportunities with PA DCNR once the transfer
 and sale of the property occurs
- Completed a Progress Report for the Hicks Creek Natural Stream Channel Design/Construction Project and
 Program Reimbursement; EPCAMR's Project Officer Dennis Palladino retired and EPCAMR was informed that our
 new Project Officer will be Gregg Davis, PA DEP BAMR; Sent a request to PA DEP NE Region to see how our Joint
 Permit Approval Process is coming along so that we can proceed with preparing the bid package and on-site pre-bid
 meeting prior to construction
- Followed up with Joe Sapienza on the upcoming abandoned mine lands cleanup in Centralia, PA; Contacted Greg Yeager, Aristes Hose Company #1 to see if they would come down and water down the tires that will be collected and worked with the Centralia Fire Company's Tom Hynoski to get permission to utilize the Borough Building as our Central Command for the Cleanup on October 25th, 2014; Worked with Pagnotti Enterprises and Blaschak Coal Company to obtain permission to place dumpsters on their properties that border Centralia for the cleanup and received their permission and support following the creation of a Waiver of Liability that is standard in these types of projects created by EPCAMR; Put out a Call for Volunteers through EPCAMR's online MailChimp Campaign tool; Bridgestone Tire is a new partner that will be recycling all tires picked up at the event for us through the Tires4ward Program; PennFuture's NE Office will be participating in the cleanup and assisted with publicity; Wilkes University will be providing 20 or more students as a part of their college's participation in the annual Make A Difference Day community service project; http://epcamr.org/home/2014/clean-up-centralia-epcamr-assesses-trash-problem-in-americas-lost-town-for-october-25th-2014-cleanup/; https://www.indiegogo.com/projects/clean-up-centralia-pa
- Participated in a Conference Call with the Leadership Team of the PA State Consortia to plan out the agenda for the EE Capacity Community of Learners upcoming Meeting
- On September 3, 2014 the Antrim Treatment Trust (Treatment Trust) was issued a license by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) to operate a 40 kW micro-hydropower project in Duncan Township, Tioga County Pennsylvania; This is the <u>first project ever</u> licensed by FERC that uses mine drainage to generate electricity that can be sold on the grid; The power generated by the Antrim Micro-Hydropower Project (AMHP) will help offset the operational cost of the Antrim Treatment Plant that abates the largest source of mine drainage within the Babb Creek Watershed; Excess electricity generated by the AMHP will be sold on the grid to help provide much needed funding to the Treatment Trust and to help sustain the efforts of the Babb Creek Watershed Association; The AMHP was a collaborative effort of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (Moshannon District Mining Office), Babb Creek Watershed Association, Antrim Treatment Trust, ARIPPA, EPCAMR, WPCAMR, Tioga County, and the project design/build partner, BioMost, Inc.
- Continued to work with Ray Clarke, Huber Breaker Preservation Society and PA DEP BAMR to coordinate an effort
 to pick up the Pink Ash Fan from the former Pink Ash Colliery up in Richmondale, PA to place it as an industrial
 heritage art piece in the Huber Miner's Memorial Park, Ashley, PA
- EPCAMR Staff conducted a cleanup on abandoned mine lands and the Green Trail along the Mocanaqua Loop Trail
 System owned by the Earth Conservancy, just outside of Lee, PA
- Followed up with *Ben Larson*, PA Fish & Boat Commission to check on the status of the Mitigation Funding package from PA DOT for the upcoming Solomon Creek Stream Restoration and Habitat Improvement Project in Ashley, PA;

Developed a new partnership with *Ross Hill*, Aquascapes Unlimited, that offers wetland plants for stream stabilization projects and informed them that we would follow up in Spring 2015 when we know more details about the project
